Diversity is a little hard to place in the EDLD progression.






The early church had diversity issues, too.

¹ In Caesarea there lived a Roman army officer[a] named Cornelius, who was a captain of the Italian Regiment.



¹⁶ The same vision was repeated three times. Then the sheet was suddenly pulled up to heaven.






Why is Diversity important in the life of the local church?
