EMOTIONALLY FOCUSED: FOUNDATION ONLINE INTENSIVE (FORMERLY FAITHWALKING) - Friday, November 12 5:30pm-10pm & Saturday, November 13 9am-3:30pm - \$50 - The Emotionally Focused: Foundation Online Intensive is a two-day experience that helps us dive into our journey of personal transformation. Sometimes we don't understand why we struggle to show up and be the authentic person that God wants us to be in our family and day to day relationships. This online intensive helps us look at times and places in our lives that have shaped us and still affect us years later. As we grow in self-awareness we can learn to turn off some of the automatic responses that lead to fear, anger, habitual sin, anxiety, and so much more. Believing who God says we are made to be and receiving his love and acceptance has the power to transform us, helping us to become a calm peaceful presence in all our interactions. This class will introduce you to the power of the kingdom and equip you to see more healing. We look at and learn from the model of Jesus' healing ministry in the Bible and see how we are given the same authority to see healing through the Holy Spirit today. STORIES OF HOPE *HOW GOD'S WORKING IN OUR LIVES*

KELLY'S STORY

Art has always been a part of my life. Even as a little girl, I wanted to be an artist. In my baby book, my mom wrote, “Kelly is an artist. She draws detailed pictures every night after her bath.” My life with God didn’t start until much later though. Looking back, I can see how God used art in my life to help bring me into a relationship with him, as well as how he continues to use me and my art to speak to others about him.

I was raised in the Lutheran church but never had a personal relationship with him. I went through most of my life not believing in God or Christ or having any religious foundation of any sort. When I was a kid, I went through a period of traumatic abuse from someone I really cared about, and that greatly affected how I showed up in the world. As a teenager, I had a deep emptiness in my heart that I filled with art, but also with drugs and, when I got older, alcohol as well. Through college, getting married, and even becoming a mother, art stayed with me as a passion of my heart.

It’s God who puts the desires of our hearts in there, and he uses those desires to speak to us. The first time I really had an encounter with God was when I had an opportunity to live paint at a few concerts. I would start painting and something else would start to flow through me. Then when I would finish, it would stop. I had no way to describe it. I was starting to be more open to God, and he was starting to get my attention.

After being a stay-at-home mom for several years, I found a master artist here in Duluth that was opening a fine arts academy. My husband Andy had always wanted to move to Duluth, and I wanted to continue my art training. God was putting all the pieces together for us to get here. We got to Duluth and the Fine Arts Academy is in an old church that was converted. When I sign my daughter up for preschool, her preschool is in an old church that was converted. I would laugh about how God was going to get me into a church whether I liked it or not. My husband and I began to think, maybe there’s something to all this. We don’t know, but maybe God is pursuing us. When a friend recommended the Vineyard, we decided to check it out.

Andy and I in our adult lives had never gone to church; we were even married in a courthouse. When we got the Vineyard, it felt like God had his fingerprints all over it too, because out of all the churches in Duluth, of course, we would end up at the one that has an amazing arts program. We checked it out and it was wonderful. We felt so comfortable. It wasn’t what we were afraid church would be like. We had a lot of fears and were still not quite sure about the God thing, but we liked the messages as it was an uplifting start to our day and we just kept going.

Meanwhile, my mess was growing. We were in a new place. I didn’t really know anyone. I started drinking a lot, and everything got out of control. I started going to a Christ-based recovery program in addition to attending the Vineyard. My heart started to open more and more to the idea of God. While I was making this art and God was putting these pieces in place, it all came crashing down. I got to a point where I had to give up the alcohol or I wasn’t going to be able to continue with my art. So, I surrendered. I surrendered the mess in my life, the alcohol and drugs. That was the moment that I finally believed that God was with me and that he was going to shepherd me through this mess.


My husband and I’s marriage had been falling apart. We both received pastoral counseling and it brought us even deeper into our developing faith and our connection to the Vineyard. I started to get involved by attending the Creative Conference for the first time. Then I was asked to teach a painting class. I had never taught and I was terrified, but I just said “yes” because at that point in my life; if this is what God’s doing with my life, I’m going to say “yes” to it. God started to use and bring out my gifts and my talents. When I would feel uncomfortable, God would show up and help me.

Then God lit my husband and I’s hearts on fire. We both committed to rebuilding our marriage. I began focusing on my art career. We got baptized together. I joined a small group. I taught more classes through the Vineyard Arts Academy. I exhibited my artwork. God continued to place these cool opportunities in my way to trust him, and he keeps showing up!

I feel really blessed every day to be able to create art, and I’m going to do it as long as I can. I know that God’s going to be with me in that. When I look back on my past, he shows me that what I thought was so ugly and broken and destroyed and despicable is actually something that he’s going to use to bring a whole lot of light and love and truth to the world.

He tells me that I’m beautiful, that I’m worthy and cherished, that I’m treasured. He’s given me a home; he’s given me community. He’s given me a pretty messy past and through it, I can show people that I’m redeemed and loved. God is going to support me. I have Christ in my heart, and I get to live each day through that. I never had that before, and now it’s the basis of my entire life.

We are a community that notices people and goes out of our way to extend God's Love to them in practical ways. Join us at 5:30pm outside of Mainstream Fashion as we bless our city during the City of the North Parade by giving out hundreds of cups of free hot chocolate. This is a fun way to make strangers feel loved, noticed, and put into practice the radical welcome that God extends to each of us. This is a great event for the whole family to serve our community together.

ADOPT A FAMILY - As a church, we want to continue to find ways to partner with God to express his heart of compassion and love for our neighbors in the Twin Ports. One way we get to do that is by getting Christmas gifts for families who are struggling financially. Receiving a gift tells a family in need that they are special to God and provides a sense of normalcy for a family as they are going through a season of chaos. 
DONATIONS TO THE FREE CLOTHING CLOSET - Matthew 25 says, "Then the King will say to those on his right, 'Come, you who are blessed by my Father; take your inheritance, the kingdom prepared for you since the creation of the world. For I was hungry and you gave me something to eat, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you invited me in, I needed clothes and you clothed me...' " One of the ways we follow Jesus in this is through our Free Clothing Closet. This ministry provides free clothing to members of our community in need each week during our Fruit of the Vine Food Shelf hours Tuesdays from 6-8pm and Saturdays from 9:30-11:30am. Due to storage limitations and the pandemic, we were not able to take donations for most of the last year, but we are now accepting winter outerwear like jackets, hats, and mittens, and kids clothing (especially 3t, 4t, and 5t). If you have any of these items you'd like to donate, you can drop them off during office hours (Tuesdays-Fridays from 9-5), during food shelf hours, or during weekend worship services. As we approach the end of 2021, I find myself thinking about what a wild ride these past couple of years have been. It's somewhat telling that as a source of macabre comfort, I've been reflecting that the original Mad Max movie was set in 2021, and the past year has not quite been that difficult!

On a more serious note, I've found amazing comfort and encouragement from the pages of Marks' gospel that we've been teaching from this autumn. As we've just barely begun this study, we can already see how Jesus is inviting us to experience hope and joy and peace and love and faith as we realign our entire lives around his message of God's kingdom and availability.

An Invitation to Experience God's Peace

The peace of God is a common biblical theme around the advent season. It's one of the things the angels sang about on the night of Christ's birth:

“ Glory to God in the highest heaven,
and on earth peace to those on whom
his favor rests. - Luke 2:14 (NIV) ”

I want to encourage us to think about our experience of God's peace in a specific area as we continue to think about realigning our lives around Christ's invitation to participate in his kingdom. Our following of Jesus is meant to deeply transform the way we relate to one another.

A Different Way of Relating to Others

Especially during the upcoming holiday season, many of us will be getting together

with family and friends. For some of us, this may be the first time we've gathered with these folks in several months. While we may look forward to these reunions, many of us also experience the negative fruit of unhealthy or dysfunctional relationships as well. In order to avoid the uncomfortable situations, we sometimes cut ourselves off from people with whom we disagree, or we distance ourselves from those we find irritating or offensive. If we're honest, there are those who have distanced themselves from us for the very same reasons. Ouch; thanks a lot for bringing that up!

Many of us also experience deep emotions this time of year around the relational brokenness and loss we've experienced. The holidays seem to bring our loss and experience of relational brokenness to the surface in tangible and sometimes profound ways. In light of our experience, I couldn't think of a better time, right when these emotions tend to surface, to explore some of the ways God is inviting us allow the availability of his kingdom, his way of being to influence how we relate to each other, and how we gather together with our friends and family.

In the New Testament gospels we see Jesus interacting with all of us humans in a surprisingly healthy way—we see him making room for those who are left out. He's challenging those who have lost sight of God's extravagant and undeserved hospitality. At the same time, he's inviting anyone who realigns their lives, their entire approach to living, around him and his kingdom, around his approach to all of life, to personally experience a fullness of life that is completely transforming. Christ's kingdom, his way of

life has a profound impact on everything and especially on all of our relationships.

I've been taught, and discovered it's true, my honest curiosity about another's perspective is a key component to staying connected to them in a healthy way. Before deciding how I agree or not, and long before I try to convince them of my much better viewpoint, it's so important that I learn to get curious and ask loads of questions about how they've come to their conclusions. I've watched how my loving curiosity can open doors of relational connection that might've remained locked, not only to me, but to also God's love.

My prayer for us during this upcoming holiday season is that we personally experience God's hope and peace and joy and love—that our faith would increase. And that we would stay deeply connected to those around us; no matter our differing opinions or perspectives. The people we share this community with are our friends and family and neighbors. Our Creator loves both us and them the same. Because of his love, because of his empowering Spirit within us, I think he's inviting us to extend his kind of hospitality to those around us.
