


COMPASSION MONTH - At the Vineyard, each March we take time to highlight all God is doing in our compassion ministries. We talk about this in March because The MN FoodShare March Campaign matches a portion of the funds and donations we raise this month all the way through the first weekend in April. It is also a crucial time to increase funding for food shelves because it's right between high times for food shelves - the holidays and summertime.

Living compassionate lives is one of Duluth Vineyard Church's biggest priorities! We honestly believe that God loves people. All of us. We want to be a bridge that connects anyone who's hurting to the extravagant love of God that we have found in Jesus Christ. We do this by looking for ways to meet practical needs and by helping to connect people with a healthy community where they can thrive. Some of the ways you can get involved are:

- FRUIT OF THE VINE FOOD SHELF The Fruit of the Vine Food Shelf is open to anyone in the community facing food insecurity. Our volunteers assist guests in receiving about a week's worth of groceries. We are open twice a week- on Tuesday evenings and Saturday mornings. Related, we have behind the scenes volunteer opportunities to deliver food to shut-in's, unload food rescue trucks, and stock shelves.
- PROVIDING PERIOD PRODUCTS Lack of access to period products is a critical problem for many women and girls in our Twin Ports community, preventing them from full participation in work, school, and life. As a faith community, serving women by providing the products necessary for managing their periods with dignity is an affirming expression of how God cares for women. We offer these free feminine hygiene products each week during our Fruit of the Vine food shelf hours. We have volunteer opportunities to assist guests in this ministry area.
- **CLOTHING CLOSET** From clothes for a quickly growing newborn to a new pair of slacks for a job interview, our Clothing Closet provides free gently used clothing for guests of all ages and sizes. The Clothing Closet is open during our Fruit of the Vine food shelf hours. We are looking for volunteers to restock and assist guests in this area.
- PRISON MINISTRY Every week, volunteers on our prison ministry team transcribe the weekend sermon from the Duluth Vineyard, print it, and mail it out to about 200 prisoners from around the country. Recipients also receive birthday cards each year for their birthdays. We are looking for additional volunteers to transcribe and stuff mailing envelopes.
- LAUNDRY LOVE Our Compassion Ministries has successfully partnered with a local organization called Laundry Love. This free service for the homeless and low income is offered every Tuesday morning, and is supported by different organization each week. A team from our church wash clothes for the needy, on the first Tuesday of each month at the Laundomat in West Duluth.

STATE (C HE UNION 202

Early each year, our president updates the nation on the state of the union. I'd like to give you a little update on the state of our church. Feel free to stand and clap if you read anything you particularly like.

There's lots of ways to view and describe the Duluth Vineyard. Sometimes, we think of ourselves as a cause, a community and a corporation. We're here to serve the cause of Christ, to welcome the kingdom of God. We're also a community, a fellowship, a family. And, we're a Minnesota non-profit corporation. I'll give you a brief update on all three of these areas. But first, I have to say it: The state of our union, the state of our church, is strong... because it is and will remain built on the rock,

Cause of Christ – In Matthew 28, Jesus gave us our mission statement. As a church, we're all about making disciples, immersing folks in the trinitarian community, and teaching everyone to obey everything Jesus commanded us. We're about transformation and Jesus bringing us

Now that's happening, we're advancing the cause of Christ in lots of different places in our church: small groups, compassion ministries, VineyardKids, student ministries, street teams and Sunday services - just to name a few. And, I want to focus in on a few themes, a few of the pedals we pushed down on in 2023 and will continue to push in 2024.

Healing - Last year, we were hit with a sexual and spiritual abuse scandal. It is heartbreaking and serious and you can read about it and our response on our website. Last fall, with lament, we pressed into healing. That healing will continue in 2024, but our focus has shifted from larger, public, corporate healing to the kind of healing that happens in small groups and one-on-one meetings. If more healing is needed in your life, we encourage you to reach out to one of our pastors.

In addition, the independent investigation report from GRACE contained many useful recommendations to help us heal and improve, particularly related to being a traumainformed church. Our Senior Leadership Team is coordinating implementation of those recommendations. Again, you can read more on our website.

Culture Change - Although there are many wonderful and healthy aspects to the Duluth Vineyard culture (our focus on worship and compassion, the value we put on relationship, authenticity, and connection, just to name a few), we've also come to our senses about some unhealthy aspects of our culture. For example, our culture tended to put our leaders on a pedestal and valued performance over character.

Culture change isn't easy, but we are committed to making our culture more Christlike. It's part of our cause. If this topic interests you, some of the books we've found helpful include Bully Pulpit by Michael Kruger and A Church Called Tov and PIVOT by Scot McKnight and Laura Barringer.

Deeper Discipleship - Starting with our study of Colossians last summer, we've been putting a renewed emphasis on Jesus bringing us to life. That focus on transformation has continued into 2024 and my hope and prayer is that we'll always be focused on becoming more and more like Jesus.

This year, as we press deeper into discipleship, we're going to be taking a harder look at how exactly Jesus transforms us. We want to gain a better understanding so that we can cooperate better with the work of the Holy Spirit in us and in our church. We want to receive more of God's blessing so we can be a blessing to this world.

Community: Family of God – Even with the hardship of the last year, we've seen the Holy Spirit doing his beautiful work in our family. From folks who have started new relationships with Jesus, to meaningful transformation in longer term followers, to physical healings and folks being the hands and feet of Jesus as we've fed, clothed and done the laundry of those in need, Jesus has shown up in our family. He has a way of showing up, even in the messy parts of life, and we give him all the glory and our thanks and praise.

Further, for many in our family, this time has actually led to more engagement with and commitment to our family. We're glad to make room for those who are stepping in and stepping up in response to the Holy Spirit's call.

Corporation: Staffing and Financials

- There's more to us being a non-profit corporation, but I'll just highlight the people and the money here.

With regard to our staff team, we're having continued change this year with Casey

LaCore's retirement at the start of 2024 and Brian Brinkert moving to the Twin Cities in May. I'm glad Casey will continue to be in our community and I'm excited to see where Brian's grad school takes him in cross-cultural ministries. We've done a lot of reorganizing and revisioning with our staff, but the short answer is that Becca Eastvold has taken on most of Casey's former responsibilities and Steph Bremer will be our new Small Group Pastor. Separately, our Succession Team is hard at work addressing the need for a new Senior Pastor and you can learn more on our webpage.

As for our finances, we're doing relatively well. For 2023, our total income was \$1,460,858.96, total expense \$1,594,440.54, leaving a bottom line of -\$133,581.58. We're disappointed to be in the red for the year, but it is important to note that non-recurring investigation related expenses totaled \$129,205.29 last year and our savings were sufficient to cover the loss. For 2024, our budget is \$1,250,000 and as of mid-February we are comfortably in the black. We are extremely grateful for all who give their time and money to support God's mission here at the Duluth Vineyard.

When our American presidents give their State of the Union addresses, they often set out grand new plans and solutions for the future that rarely get achieved. By contrast, our plan is ancient and its grandness can be hidden by familiarity, but God guarantees the achievement. We are going to continue to make disciples, to let Jesus bring us to life, to serve the cause of Christ. We're going to do it by holding on to each other in a loving, outward-focused community. And, we're going to rely on our well run non-profit corporation to be sure the family has a home and the bills get paid. It may not always seem glamorous, but there is nothing in this world more powerful than God working through his church. Come, Lord, come and work through us!
