

FIRST STEPS RELATIONSHIP WITH GOD AND OTHERS

NIGHT OF WORSHIP - Sunday, November 10 at 6pm - If you love worship music, receiving prayer, and being in God's presence Night of Worship is for you! When we give God our full attention and posture our hearts to glorify and praise him the Holy Spirit meets us in powerful and tangible ways. As we prepare for Jesus' birthday celebration, join us on the Sundays before Christmas to learn how the best gift ever is available to absolutely everyone – no matter what we look like, what we've done, or how spiritual we are. On Christmas Eve, we will gather together to celebrate the best gift humanity has ever received. We will sing carols, hear the Christmas story, and consider what that can mean for our lives. This includes age appropriate programs for kids birth through 5th grade at both services. We would love to celebrate and experience the joyful gift of Christmas with you and your family!

ONLINE ONLY WEEKEND SERVICE - Sunday, December 29 - Online at 10 am Only - In any given month in our church community, we have between 200-300 people who volunteer and serve to help our church services and all its ministries function. That's a significant number of people serving and loving and leading us extremely well! With that in mind, we will be offering online services only for the weekend of Sunday, December 29 to honor these folks and to help us all rest well during the holiday season. If you're one of us who dearly love getting together on Sunday mornings, we suggest gathering together on these Sunday mornings with a few of your friends or family to share a meal, to worship together, to share a story or two of God's faithfulness over the past year, and of course to pray for and encourage one another. The online service will be held Sunday at 10am at duluthvineyard. online.church. Then, we will see you back in-person on Sunday, January 5.

FINANCIAL UPDATE

Currently, the Duluth Vineyard is "in the red" financially. Historically, it's not uncommon for giving to lag during the summer months, but then for us to finish the year strong. At this point in the year, giving of tithes and offerings is \$102,302 below what we budgeted for 2024. For the first nine months of 2024, our total income was \$932,390.90 and our total expenses were \$1,019,227.85, leaving a bottom line, net operating loss of \$86,836.95. Thank you for your generosity as we finish the year!

COMPASSION STORY

Occasionally we ask our food shelf participants to tell us their story. Here's one we recently received from KZ. "...I've been coming here for years but, it wasn't until (recently) that I really needed help. I was evicted from my home and I lived in my vehicle for almost a year. I had to stay in Duluth waiting for HUD housing. One week, I was starving and remembered the Vineyard Food Shelf. I was nervous. I hadn't gone in a while. I was uncomfortable and feeling dirty. The people (at the food shelf) were so nice to me I wanted to cry. I have housing now, but you all were a Godsend that day. Thank you, I have immense gratitude."

The Vineyard Compassion Ministries are making a difference in the lives of those we serve. But serving also changes our hearts. There's no question that God commands us to serve those in need (see Matthew 25:35-40). God does this for our own good. Serving the poor is part of being Jesus' apprentice; it can help make us more like him, and it grows our character, particularly our humility. Please consider how Jesus can use your serving as part of your discipleship journey.

PRAYER NIGHTS AT EASTSIDE - Sundays, November 3, 17 & December 15 - Dinner at 5:30pm, Prayer meeting starts at 6:30pm - Location: 3833 E Superior St - Jesus said "For where two or three gather in my name, there am I with them." If your report alleges misconduct by a particular person, your report will not be sent to that person. The operator will give you a reference number so that you may follow-up. We also strongly encourage all reports of criminal activities to be reported to law enforcement.

Christmas is amazing! It's Jesus' birthday party. Christmas is when we celebrate the ultimate gift – God giving us a savior. It's the gift of Jesus. He's an escape from all the trouble and pain in our lives. He's how we can have a new way of life, the best kind of life now and forever with him. This gift is almost too good to be true. That first Christmas, in a grubby stable, God gave us the ultimate gift, God gave us a savior.

But, who is us? Who is this gift for? Who God's gift is for is also too good to be true. It's hard for us to wrap our minds around. This Christmas season, this Advent, we're going to give it a try. We're going to let the Holy Spirit blow us away, change us, with the unbelievable availability of God's gift.

OBVIOUS AND UNBELIEVABLE

The answer to "Who is the gift for?" is pretty obvious from the Christmas story. God is not subtle. But religious folks, pastors like me, we have trouble accepting it, living like it's true. It's just too unbelievable for us. It's easier for outsiders to see it. As Simon & Garfunkel sang:

Blessed are the sat upon, spat upon, ratted on

Blessed are the meth drinkers, pot sellers, illusion dwellers.

Blessed are the penny rookers, cheap hookers, groovy lookers.

The Christmas gift of Jesus is for them. Not because they are abused, addicts, immoral. No, the gift is so amazing because it's available in spite of and in the midst of the worst of circumstances.

THE CHRISTMAS STORY

This Christmas, let's pay closer attention to the Christmas story, particularly those of us like me that know it well. God was super intentional about the way he sent his son. Jesus' arrival on this planet teaches us a ton.

Jesus didn't arrive on this planet surrounded by comfort, luxury or even safety. At the

time, he wasn't born into a royal or priestly family. No. His mom bore the shame of being unmarried and his adopted dad was a poor, working class carpenter. Today, maybe his mom would have bore the shame and confusion of being transgender. His dad struggling to make ends meet as an Uber driver.

At the time, Jesus' birth wasn't announced by angels to the celebrities, the people that mattered. No. Glorious angels announced the good news of his birth to dirty, smelly shepherds keeping watch over their flocks in the fields. Today, maybe those beautiful angles would have appeared to illegal immigrants in a parking lot, covered in gunk after a long shift at the meat packing plant. Maybe the angels' glorious song would have been sung in Spanish.

At the time, Jesus didn't receive birthday gifts from the in crowd, the right people. No. It was pagans, outsiders, Magi with messed up beliefs, that noticed the star, that brought their gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh. Today, maybe his gifts could have come from Native Americans, Muslims, or even the dreaded secular humanists.

Do we see the point God's making here – at Christmas? He's not doing it like we'd expect on purpose. His way is better. His gift, the ultimate gift, really is for everyone. Do we truly believe that it's for us, you and me? It is. Who do we have trouble believing that it's for? This Christmas, the Holy Spirit can help us reach out to them.

THE BEATITUDES

Maybe this all seems perfectly obvious to you. God's gift, the kingdom of God, is available to everyone. Easy-peasy. But some of us, particularly folks like me who have been following Jesus for awhile, we can often use some help getting our hearts and minds around this incredible truth, and use some help living like it's true. Thankfully, Jesus has got our back. He gave us the Beatitudes.

This advent, I am so looking forward to unpacking the Beatitudes (Matthew 5:3-12 and Luke 6:17-26) with you. What they say about the availability of God's gift is incredible! Dallas Willard talks about the Beatitudes in Chapter 4 of The Divine Conspiracy. I recently reread it and it brought me to tears. God loves us so much! Let me give you a taste of what Willard says:

Jesus did not say, "Blessed are the poor in spirit because they are poor in spirit."He did not think, "What a fine thing it is to be destitute of every spiritual attainment or quality. It makes people worthy of the kingdom..."

Those poor in spirit are called "blessed" by Jesus, not because they are in a meritorious condition, but because, precisely in spite of and in the midst of their ever so deplorable condition, the rule of the heavens has moved redemptively upon and through them by the grace of Christ...

The religious system of his day left the multitudes out, but Jesus welcomed them all into his kingdom. Anyone could come as well as any other. They still can. That is the gospel of the Beatitudes...

So we must see from our hearts that:

Blessed are the physically repulsive,
Blessed are those who smell bad,
The twisted, misshapen, deformed,
The too big, too little, too loud,
The bald, the fat, and the old—
For they are all riotously celebrated in
the party of Jesus.

And, that party started at Christmas.
